

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MEETING
TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2019**

Chairperson Bob Yoder called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. in the Courthouse chambers in regular session. Items on the agenda included the following: approval of agenda; ownership change related to The Kalona Golf Club liquor license application; application for Class B Beer (BB) License (including wine coolers) with Outdoor Services and Sunday Sales from the Kalona Golf Club; Washington County Recycling Update – Lynn Whaley, WEMIGA; presentation related to Crisis Intervention Training program; public comment; adjourn. Supervisors Stan Stoops, Abe Miller, Richard Young, and Jack Seward, Jr., were also present.

Others attending were: Gretchen Teske, Washington Evening Journal; Mary Zielinski, The News; Sally Hart, KCII Radio; John Gish, County Attorney; Cyndie Sinn, County IT/Budget Director; Jeff Garrett, County Treasurer; Jo Greiner, County Recorder; Shawn Ellingson, Deputy Sheriff; Bobbie Wulf, County Mental Health/Disabilities Director; Alan Brady, Jail Alternatives Coordinator; Lynn Whaley, WEMIGA; Amber Williams, Board of Supervisors Administrative Assistant; and citizens Karyl Miller, Bill Miller, Charlotte Stalder, and Denny Stalder.

On motion by Stoops, seconded by Miller, the Board voted to approve the agenda as published.

On motion by Seward, seconded by Young, the Board voted to acknowledge an ownership change related to the Kalona Golf Club liquor license renewal application and to authorize the Chairperson to sign the application on behalf of the Board.

On motion by Seward, seconded by Young, the Board voted to approve a renewal of a Class B Beer (BB) License (including wine coolers) with Outdoor Services and Sunday Sales for the Kalona Golf Club, 1376 Highway 1 South, Kalona, Iowa, for the period of April 1, 2019 to March 31, 2020. Sheriff Jared Schneider expressed no objection to approval of the application.

Lynn Whaley, on behalf of WEMIGA Waste Systems, briefed the Board on recent activity at the Washington County Recycling Center during the month of January 2019. During the month WEMIGA processed 60.61 landfill tons, 28.14 recyclable tons, 11 appliances, 25 televisions and other electronic devices, 0 tires, and 7 gallons of used oil. Total landfill tons for the month of December 2018 were 72.89. The Board took no formal action. The complete report is available in the office of the Washington County Auditor.

Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Coordinator Alan Brady presented information regarding CIT training and described CIT as being an important benefit to Washington County as well as seven other counties in southeast Iowa. Individuals who undertake the training, such as law enforcement officers, learn how to safely and effectively address the needs of people in the community with mental illness. Brady stated that his organization is attempting to repair the holes in the nation's fragmented health care system, identify what is going on, and assist people through treatment instead of putting them in jail. Topics included in the 40-hour training include child and adolescent intervention, hospital procedures, mental health disorders such as psychosis and schizophrenia, personality disorders, and addictions. CIT training is especially important for law enforcement personnel because such individuals are often the first point of contact for people in need of mental health assistance. The board took no action.

There was no public comment.
