Important Questions	Answers	Why this Matters:
What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?	\$1,000 person/\$2,000 family per calendar year.	Generally, you must pay all the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes. Well-child care, <u>in-network urgent care</u> , <u>in-network preventive care</u> , <u>in-network outpatient labs</u> , <u>in-network routine vision exams</u> , <u>in-network prosthetic limbs</u> , <u>in-network colonoscopies</u> , <u>in-network office services</u> , services <u>subject to drug copayments and transplant services</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	No. There are no other <u>deductibles</u> .	You must pay all of the costs for these services up to the specific deductible amount before this plan begins to pay for these services. You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.
What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u> ?	Health: \$2,000 person/\$4,000 family per calendar year. Drug Card: \$4,600 person/\$9,200 family per calendar year. The In- <u>Network</u> health and drug card out-of-pocket maximum amounts accumulate separately.	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.
What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> ?	Premiums, penalties, transplant services, <u>balance-billed charges</u> , and health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .

Important Questions	Answers	Why this Matters:
Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u> ?	Yes. See www.wellmark.com or call 1-800-524-9242 for a list of health <u>network providers</u> .	This plan uses a <u>provider network</u> . You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the plan's <u>network</u> . You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the provider's charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays (<u>balance billing</u>). Be aware, your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u> ?	No.	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes.

If you don't have Minimum Essential Coverage for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month. **This plan or policy *does* provide minimum essential coverage.**


Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes.

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace. **This plan or policy *does* meet the minimum value standard for the benefits it provides.**

About These Coverage Examples:

 **This is not a cost estimator.** Treatments shown are just examples of how this plan might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your providers charge, and may other factors. Focus on the cost sharing amounts (deductibles, copayments and coinsurance) and excluded services under the plan. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health plans. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

Peg is Having a Baby (9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

- The plan's overall deductible \$1,000
- PCP copayment \$20
- Hospital(facility) coinsurance 10%
- Other coinsurance 10%

Primary care physician office visits (*including disease education*)
Diagnostic tests (*blood work*)
Prescription drugs
Durable medical equipment (*glucose meter*)

Mia's Simple Fracture (in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)

- The plan's overall deductible \$1,000
- Specialist copayment \$20
- Emergency room copayment \$100 and 10%
- Durable medical equip. coinsurance 10%
